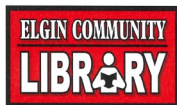

Fall Friday Hikes

A series of 4 hikes, limited to 10 participants. These hikes will be about 3 hours in length.

You will need hiking boots or tennis shoes with a good tread, a back or fanny pack to carry water (I suggest at least 3 bottles), and a small snack such as fruit, trail mix or a sandwich. I also highly recommend a walking stick to help with balance. I provide the snake guards.

Oct. 29: Little Baldy: Drive past the Visitor's Center to where the road T's, turn right, keep going around a curve, until you see the sign that says Environmental Education Center, turn left and go to the end of the road to the big parking lot. **Meet here by 8:30.** (If you see Camp Doris sign, you have gone a bit too far.) We will start hiking from that point to Little Baldy. We will go to the top, which is a fairly easy ascent and affords some nice views. We will then go to one of the larger gold mines that is about 15 minutes from Little Baldy.

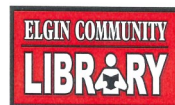
Nov. 5: Post Oak Falls: We will meet at 8am along the shoulder of road in front of the Visitor's Center and caravan from that point. It will take another 20-30 minutes to get to Treasure Lake/Post Oak Lake. This hike has a few short incline's, but is mostly level. We will see Post Oak Falls, and Little Niagara.

Nov. 12: Miner's Rock: Drive past the Visitor's Center to where the road T's, turn right, keep going west until you pass the Sunset/Elk Mountain sign. Shortly after that, on the left, you will see Caddo Lake. Pull into the gravel parking lot. **Meet here by 8:30.** There is very limited parking by Miner's Rock, so we will carpool from this point. There are some short inclines on this hike, but nothing that strenuous.

Nov. 19: Elk Mountain: Drive past the Visitor's Center to where the road T's, turn right, keep going west until you see the Sunset/Elk Mountain sign. Turn left, and go to the last parking area. **Meet here by 8:30.** We will go to the top of Elk Mountain and see some interesting landmarks while there. The trail is very established going up, and we will take multiple breaks. Potentially this hike could take up to 4 hours, depending on the number and length of breaks needed.

***If it is raining, that particular hike will be rescheduled to Dec. 3. Since the hikes are funded by a grant, there will be a 5-question survey for each hike, and pics will be taken and posted on social media.*

*****If you hiked with us this past spring, you are more than capable of doing these 4 hikes.*



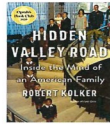
